NEW LAW REQUIRES SCHOOLS TO IMPLEMENT ABUSE PROGRAMS

Indiana's children have additional protections from physical and sexual abuse by virtue of a new law championed by State Sen. Frank Mrvan.

Signed into law in May by Gov. Eric Holcomb, the law requires the Indiana Department of Education to provide model policies and reporting procedures for child sexual abuse to assist school districts in implementing programs in grades K-12 no later than July 1, 2018.

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan said, ultimately it was the 73 students from Whiting, Hammond, East Chicago, Highland and Munster who came forward with first-person accounts of horrific abuse that moved legislators to enact the No More Secrets law.

"This law is a testament to individuals who had the courage to come forward," he said. "After seeing the impact our campaign had in our area, we knew we needed to further solidify our work by ensuring this message reverberated throughout the whole state."

Children who have come forward to report abuse are receiving counseling. "The sooner children are moved away from the abuse, the greater their chances for living full, productive lives," Mrvan said. "No More Secrets gives children the support they need to fulfill their dreams."

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING PROGRAM TO HELP OUR HOMELESS VETERANS

North Township and the Housing Authority of East Chicago are partnering to end veteran homelessness.

A four-unit complex that is being refurbished for veterans and their families will be ready for occupancy this fall.

The program provides more than shelter for homeless and struggling veterans who have fallen on hard times.

North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan said what differentiates this initiative from others is its focus on family.

“We will be working with families to provide wrap-around services, such as financial literacy, mental health, job placement and transportation as well as transitioning these veterans into home ownership,” Mrvan said.

Veterans advocate Jim Chancellor, who has spent years helping former soldiers

adjust following active duty, will be assisting in the effort.

“These veterans are struggling with the emotions of war and the family is a huge part of the healing,” he said. “When you separate them, it does an injustice.

Once an individual is accepted into the program, there is no deadline to leave.

“Our veterans can stay as long as it takes to help them become self-sustaining,” Mrvan said. “They put their lives on the line for us. It’s the very least we can do to help them.”

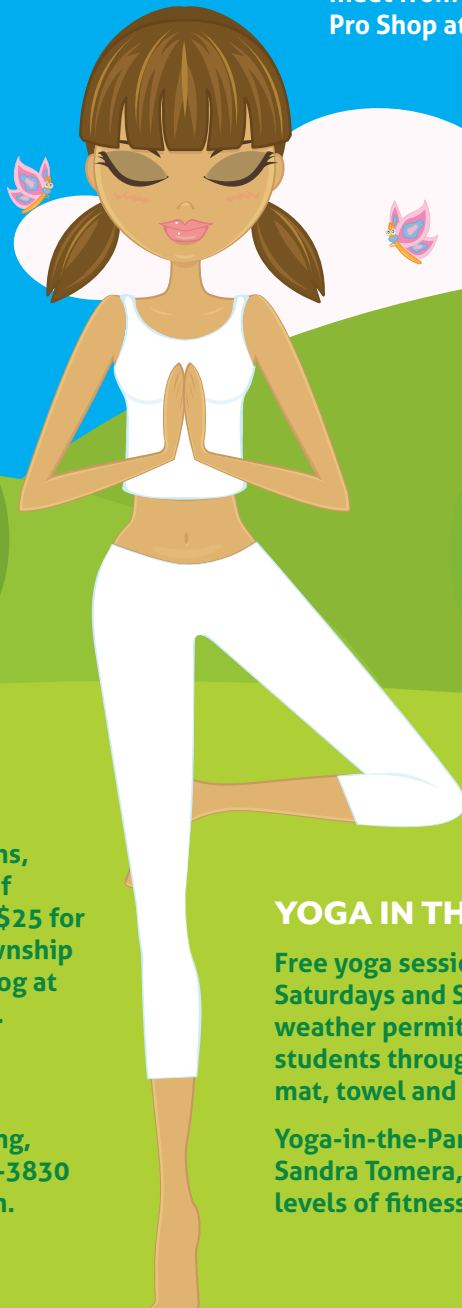
