NO MORE SECRETS

North Township trustee, state senator galvanizing support to end child sex abuse throughout Indiana

The two Franks – North Township Trustee Mrvan and his father, state senator Mrvan – are working to end child sexual abuse throughout Indiana.

Known as No More Secrets, they are doing what they do best.

In Indianapolis, state Sen. Mrvan is championing a bill that requires the Indiana Department of Education to provide model policies and reporting procedures for child sexual abuse. The law will assist districts with implementing sexual abuse education programs in grades K-12 no later than July 1, 2018.

The bill passed the state Senate Feb. 13 and will be introduced in the House later this month.

Closer to home, the trustee is launching No More Secrets March 13-17 at the five school districts in North Township.

He won't be alone.

ana ranks second in the nation for forced sexual intercourse among high school females.

"One act causes an enormous wave of family destruction and, more than likely, emotional and physical abuse that tears the fabric of society," he said.

"If we are going to boast about bringing in new businesses and improving quality of life, this is one topic that needs to be discussed. Education is our best weapon in this fight."

TOWNSHIP PARTNERS WITH LAUW TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE

North Township is partnering with Lake Area United Way to make resources easier to find for families in need.

Known as the United for Families Network, the goal of the new initiative is to create a coalition of social service agencies, faith-based organizations and government entities that deliver services to Lake County households that do not earn enough to pay for their basic needs.

Known as ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) families, this demographic represents one in four households in Lake County.

"We are attacking problems facing AL-ICE families while searching for solutions for lasting, sustainable change," said Kristin Marlow-Kellemen, United for Families Network Coordinator.

Township Trustee Frank Mrvan said the ability to share information among all providers is groundbreaking.

"This will allow us to capture the data of assistance," Mrvan said. That information will position our community to help move all our struggling working families into financial stability and perhaps eradicate poverty for good."

ENHANCEMENTS COMING THIS SPRING TO WICKER MEMORIAL PARK

A mild winter with warmer temps and little snow has Wicker Memorial Park crews eager to begin two new projects this spring.

Park Superintendent Brett Bierman said nearly all of the ash trees infected with the Emerald Ash Borer have been removed.

"We've been awarded \$8,750 in federal funds as part of the 2016 Community and Urban Forestry Assistance grant," Bierman said. "This project will allow us to plant 120 replacements as soon as the ground thaws."

But that's not all.

Beginning in April, a new fence featuring brick columns and black aluminum railing will be installed along Ridge Road with new entrances at Prairie Street and the west end of Wicker Memorial Park.

"These additions will continue to enhance the beauty of our park."
