As he has for the last 19 years, Paul Day will spend a September Sunday riding his Harley with more than 2,000 fellow veterans – supporting those who returned from the military with needs that outstripped their means.

Beyond the excitement of hearing the bikes fire up, Day and his fellow veterans get satisfaction knowing they raise money for veteran causes.

"Every day, 22 veterans commit suicide," he said. "These are soldiers who fought bravely for our country. It is our privilege to do all we can to help them."

The ride exits Wicker Memorial Park at 11:30 a.m., heads west on Ridge, south on Calumet, east on US 30, north on Taft/Cleveland then west on Ridge back. Please note there will be traffic delays as the ride makes its way through the route.

AUTISM PROGRAM HELPING TO KEEP SPECIAL NEEDS INDIVIDUALS SAFE

The School City of East Chicago and the city's police department are partnering with North Township to launch a pilot autism awareness and safety program this autumn.

By mid-August, 75 East Chicago families registered for the voluntary program that identifies special-needs individuals through bracelets, necklaces or shoe clips to help law enforcement work with them and treat them according to their condition.

"Police are at a disadvantage when they encounter children with autism and other disabilities because these kids look – but don't act – like others their age," said Gilda Orange, the township's assistant chief deputy.

"Parents and guardians have completed forms identifying comforting items that are part of a go-bag police carry with them. That, along with specialized training, are providing another layer to keep kids safe."

INDIANAPOLIS ADOPTS 'NO MORE SECRETS' CAMPAIGN TO END CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE

The Indiana Township Association in partnership with North Township and National Urban Fellows is advancing the "No More Secrets" community engagement campaign throughout the state.

Indianapolis will be the first community outside of North Township to establish the program universally geared to assisting victims of child sexual abuse, educating those who work with children regarding child sexual abuse and engaging law enforcement to help those who have been harmed.

It will be New York City-based National Urban Fellows that will provide the boots-on-the-ground to launch the program that will serve nearly 160,000 Marion County students.

TOWNSHIPS UNITED...

Known as Townships United Against Child Sexual Abuse, the Indiana Township Association program has a long-range goal to end child sexual abuse. In its formative stage, the group is targeting early identification and assistance for victims.

It is a transformation North Township Trustee Frank Mrvan hadn't yet envisioned when he saw a study in 2016 that showed Indiana ranked second in the nation for child sexual abuse.

"Child sexual abuse is all too pervasive," he said. "If there was one child impacted, it is one too many. Our goal is to press forward to change the status quo."


