NO MORE SECRETS SEXUAL ABUSE PREVENTION CAMPAIGN EXPANDS

The strength of North Township's "No More Secrets" campaign to end child sexual abuse is prompting other Indiana communities to begin programs of their own.

The effort assists victims, educates those who work with children and engages law enforcement to help those who have been harmed.

Delaware Township Trustee Debbie Driskell, who also serves as director of the Indiana Township Association, said more than 125 attended a "No More Secrets" symposium held in suburban Indianapolis in April.

"Reaction in our community has been overwhelmingly positive."

Indiana township trustees were alerted to the program and its

success when North Township Trustee Frank J. Mrvan spoke at their annual conference in September.

"Frank's talk is what inspired me to bring the program to Fishers," Driskell said.

"No community is immune to this threat," Mrvan said. "It is important to keep talking about preventing child sexual abuse and giving victims a place to get help."

Driskell is a believer.

"We are just beginning a statewide effort called Townships United Against Child Sexual Abuse," she said. "Every community should have a program like this."

What began as the township's first drug take-back day — where four carloads of unneeded medications were collected — has led to a new, vital partnership. However, if there is a work disruption, we have a plan to provide for families. 
