SOCIAL WORK TEAM PROVIDING LONG-TERM HELP

North Township's Social Work Restore Team is working with local police providing wraparound services for vulnerable populations.

Community Development Coordinator Rosie Quintanilla said the team works with those struggling with issues related to domestic violence, autism, elder abuse, sexual assault, suicide and even those who are undocumented immigrants.

The Restore Team includes Quintanilla, Community Support Specialist Brittany Cooper and social work interns Janet Miodragovic and Shakiyla Holloway. Together, they work with regional social service agencies – such as Highland-based Fair Haven and Catholic Charities – to provide long-term assistance.

Miodragovic, who spent her summer working with North Township clients, said it is rewarding to help those most in need.

"We are so new, but are gaining traction," Quintanilla said. "This as an opportunity to break the cycle and our clients are eager for change."

MEET OUR KEYNOTE ...

Join us in welcoming Maj. Gen. John Borling, USAF (retired), our V4V keynote speaker. The suburban Chicago native, was shot down June 1, 1966 and became a POW at the Hanoi Hilton for 6-1/2 years until he was released in 1973. Maj. Gen. Borling has received many medals, including the Bronze Star, Silver Star and the Purple Heart and is the author of "Taps on the Wall, Poems from the Hanoi Hilton."





GOLD STAR FAMILY



Army National Guard Spc. Sergio Eduardo Perez grew up in East Chicago and graduated from Lake Central. He died just three years later when his vehicle was hit by rocket-propelled grenades in Kandahar Province, Afghanistan.

His family will be honored Nov. 11 as the 2019 North Township Gold Star Family at Wicker Park Social Center.

It is a bittersweet honor for Veronica Orozco and her three daughters. "It seems like only yesterday Sergio was here, planning his future after the military," the Gold Star mother said. "The Gold Star organization has made this wound more bearable than it would have been. My pain is their pain and their pain is mine. We help each other."

COMMANDERS INITIATIVE

When Mike Planer returned from Vietnam, he joined 2,200 other veterans at East Chicago's American Legion Post 369 where they supported each other. Today, that post's membership is down by 75 percent.

Trustee Frank J. Mrvan said Post 369 isn't alone. Across the country, efforts to rebuild century-old veteran's organizations like the Legion and VFW are failing.

Mrvan and commanders from more than a dozen local veteran's groups are banding together at monthly meetings to discuss the issue and find solutions.

"Veterans groups have splintered between Vietnam and the more recent conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan," Planer said. "I applaud Frank for what he's doing to bring these groups back to vitality."



COMMANDER'S CORNER

Chester Amyra was honorably discharged in 1991, four years after he joined the U.S. Army. It would be another 20 years before the veteran would join Hessville's American Legion Post 232. When the organization put out the call for a new commander, it was Amyra who stepped up. Unlike many other area legion groups, the Lansing, Ill. native said Post 232 is beginning to grow – again. "We have a couple hundred active members. Many of us are also 232 Legion Riders – our very own veterans motorcycle group. We are a place that welcomes veterans to participate in any activity that suits them."
