"YOU DO NOT STAND ALONE"

Welcome Wanisha Gail Joseph and her young son Isaiah, the first residents of Narva House – a home rehabbed and furnished for a veteran who needs a helping hand to become self-sufficient again.

Following a dedication, blessing and celebration at the East Chicago house on a particularly stormy day in May, the real work has begun to provide the makings of productive lives – and even brighter futures.

Joseph knows it won't be easy.

She trusts the partners in the Victory for Veterans Initiative will assist her at every turn. The home – and the program – has already been a life-changer.

"Wanisha is a survivor in a world where returning veterans have inherent difficulties adjusting to day-to-day life outside the confines of military service," North Township Trustee Frank J. Mrvan said. "In the military, mission is everything. Losing that focus can cost you your life and that of your fellow soldiers."

Joseph's return to civilian life was complicated by PTSD, a sexual assault and a related substance abuse issue that eventually left her and Isaiah homeless.

"As she says, that was her past," Mrvan said. "Narva House is the gateway to her future."

RELAY4AUTISM BRINGS FAMILIES TO WICKER PARK FOR DAY OF FUN

Wicker Memorial Park's Splash Pad is reserved and emergency vehicles have been booked for North Township's first-ever Relay4Autism.

The Aug. 3 event will bring families together for a day of fun and fellowship, fostering awareness and growth of the township's autism safety initiative.

Community Development Coordinator Rosie Quintanilla is still looking for event sponsors and relay teams.

"We have 180 families signed up as part of the autism safety project," Quintanilla said. "Studies show that individuals with autism are most at risk when they come into contact with law enforcement. The township is providing training to local law enforcement, bracelets that identify autistic individuals to police and sensory bags to help make interactions less frightening."

For many families, a spouse or child who disappears is the nightmare that never ends.

Nationwide, 600,000 men, women and children go missing every year.

North Township's Missing Persons Day will draw attention to local residents who have disappeared without a trace and look for clues to aid in solving cold cases.

Families are invited to join professionals from the National Missing & Unidentified Persons System for assistance in finding those who have disappeared.

NamUs specializes in finding missing persons and identifying the 4,400 bodies recovered each year – 1,000 of which remain unidentified after one year.

"We have families in our region whose hearts break every day a loved one remains unaccounted for," Trustee Frank J. Mrvan said. "This event provides free assistance to families who need to know what happened."
