FALLEN HEROES MEMORIAL TAKES SHAPE

A year after breaking ground on a memorial to fallen police, firefighters and emergency medical services personnel at Wicker Memorial Park, work is buttoning up on the project in time for an Oct. 3 dedication.

North Township Trustee Frank J. Mrvan said there is still time to contribute to the project through the purchase of a brick, granite inlay or to have the name of an individual or company name engraved on one of the reflection benches located strategically throughout the monument to allow visitors to rest and reflect.

"COVID-19 put us a little bit behind on the fundraising," Mrvan said. "Through the generosity of the community and the efforts of Dean's Landscaping, The Idea Factory, Hill-side Funeral Home and Cremation Center, Memorial Coordinator Renee Ramos, Highland Police Cmdr. John Banasiak and our dedicated first responders, I know we will meet our goal."

To date, more than 200 individuals, businesses and corporations have donated. The generosity of those donations is incorporated in the bricks, inlays and benches of the memorial.

TOWNSHIP PUTS DISTANCING MEASURES IN PLACE FOR 2021 SHELTER RESERVATIONS

Wicker Memorial Park is putting new protocols in place for the 2021 picnic shelter reservation process that will go into effect Jan. 4.

Renee Ramos, who heads up picnic shelter reservations, said the ongoing pandemic coupled with seasonal flu makes the past practice of accepting shelter reservations in close quarters at the park office unworkable.

"People begin lining up hours before we open on the first day we begin accepting reservations in the new year," she said.

"We expect social distancing will remain in effect. With that in mind, we will be issuing a new plan in early December to address how we can best meet the needs of our residents."

VICTORY FOR VETERANS MEMORIAL RIDE CANCELED

The 2020 Victory for Veterans Memorial Ride has been canceled.

A tradition for the last 20 years, North Township Trustee Frank J. Mrvan said COVID-19 and the ongoing threat it poses left him no other choice.

"Welcoming more than 2,000 veterans and their loved ones to Wicker Park is an honor," Mrvan said. "It was profound concern over the health of these individuals that made the decision for me. These are heroes who have sacrificed their blood, sweat and tears for our freedoms."

The township and the American Veterans Motorcycle Riders Association Chapter 1 – which partner on the ride – are exploring virtual fundraising options that will be detailed later this fall.

AVMRA Cmdr. Paul Day said everyone is disappointed that circumstances beyond anyone's control led to the event being canceled.

"We will be planning something even if it's just a get together on a smaller scale," Day said. "We'll get past this."

The event, which raises about \$30,000 a year, funds veterans programs along with enhancements to the Wicker Park Veterans Memorial.

"I understand this is a difficult decision, but COVID-19 is a serious issue and we must do what is best for the health of our fellow veterans," said Chester Colvin, commander of American Legion Post 232 in Hammond.

"Our veterans understand the toll war exacts and are often reluctant to share those feelings with those who have not served," Mrvan said. "The ride has been an opportunity for them to gather together as brothers and sisters who can relate, relax and enjoy that day together.

"Once this virus is behind us, Victory for Veterans will ride again."
