TRUSTEES ADVOCATE FOR TOWNSHIP GOVERNMENT

Township government in Indiana has served the complex needs of individuals and families who need a leg up when circumstances outweigh resources.

Rent and mortgage assistance as well as vouchers to pay to heat their homes and pay medical bills. Along the way, the Indiana General Assembly tasked townships to take over the expenses of cemeteries that had become insolvent.

Today, the state is trying to dismantle the system that has been in place for more than 175 years.

In response, North Township Trustee Adrian A. Santos and his colleagues, charged with providing critical resources to the poor in Indiana's 1,008 townships spread across 92 counties, are fighting

for those who can't fight for themselves as state government aims to eliminate township government.

Santos said they are lobbying on behalf of the 716,580 households whose incomes fall below the federal poverty level and who need township assistance to get through the tough times.

"The state wants to make township resources the responsibility of Indiana's 92 counties," he said. "There are multiple problems with this plan, which never considered the hardships families face when they become part of the working poor."

CHIEF DEPUTY HELPING LOCAL RESIDENTS GET TOWNSHIP ASSISTANCE FOR NEARLY 40 YEARS

Virginia Carter was looking for employment when she found the career of a lifetime at the North Township Trustee's Office.

"I started in intake and moved up to being a caseworker," she said. "I had no idea then how invaluable township assistance could be for families that had fallen on hard times. "We were the last place that would offer mortgage and rental assistance that allowed people to keep a roof over their heads. Today, we work with CoAction, an organization that coordinates an energy assistance program as well as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

Carter, now chief deputy, is celebrating her 39th year at North

Township this year.

"I can't think of a better job for me. Every day, we work to provide a hand up to the people who need it most," she said. "Trustee Adrian A. Santos has one goal: to do everything in our power to provide the services each client needs. We do just that from our Hammond and East Chicago township trustee offices."

"We squeeze every penny, but there are always more needs than there are dollars," she said. "It's what we do and I'm grateful we are here."
